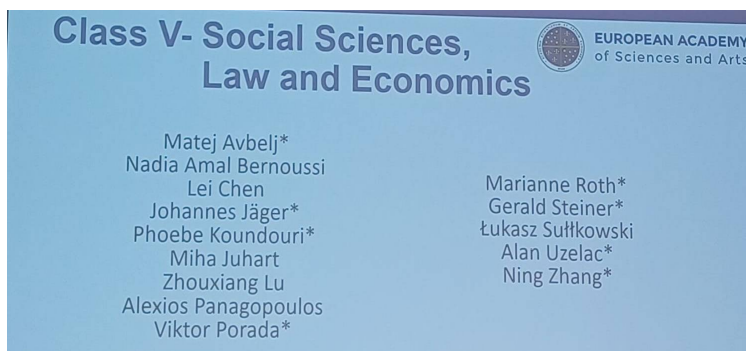


fig. 2 New members of the V class academy (order: first from right: academy president Klaus Maizner, Prof. Porada, third in order)
